14-19 Learning Pathways

The 14-19 Learning Pathways department is made up of 7 classes:

- ◆ Pine
- ◆ Birch
- ◆ Cedar
- ◆ Maple
- ◆ Beech
- ◆ Oak
- ◆ Hawthorn

All students access a varied curriculum of accredited learning.

Our Learning Pathways allow students to access 6 Key elements of Education.

The six key elements are:

- ◆ Individual Learning Pathways tailored to meet the needs of each learner
- ◆ Wider Choice and Flexibility
- ◆ The Learning Core which includes skills, knowledge, understanding, values and experiences
- ◆ Learning Coach Support
- ◆ Access to Personal Support
- ◆ Impartial Careers Advice and Guidance.

Our students access a curriculum based on ASDAN and Agored Cymru accredited learning.

The department is making full use of our school café - Caffi Oren. Students follow accredited courses based on hospitality and catering whilst working in the café. Students make lunches for school visitors and open the cafe weekly to school staff. They experience every aspect of running the café, from preparing the food, to handing money and making sales.

ASDAN



Students complete a variety of ASDAN programmes. All programmes aim to develop the student's key skills and skills for life.

Key Stage 4 students complete modules from the Transition Challenge programme. Modules include:

- Knowing how
- Feeling Good
- Taking the Lead
- Making Choices
- Moving Forward

Transition Challenge provides a framework of activities to develop and accredit independent living and personal skills for learners.

Transition Challenge works through areas of activity relating to statutory programmes of study for National Curriculum subjects, complemented by activities contributing to the skills of adult living.

Post 16 Students complete Towards Independence modules

Towards Independence provides a framework of activities through which personal, social and independence skills are developed. With over 60 modules available, we ensure that students have access to a variety of learning opportunities. Modules include Everyday Living, Personal Safety, Multi-sensory experiences, Using ICT and Technology, Horticulture and Meal Preparation.

Agored Cymru



Students access 3 accredited pathways each year.

During these lessons all students follow accredited units and participate in a range of activities that enhance their curriculum. Students also benefit from being taught by several teachers within the department.

Options

Students are given the opportunity to choose a subject to study each year. The choices include:
